#### 6. Discussion Items

#### A. Review of Board Attendance Guidelines

• Commissioner Jeffery reviewed the statutory attendance requirements for board members, as well steps for advance notice for an expected absence. As soon as you know you can't attend, please contact Commissioner Jeffery and Executive Director Rini. Please respect staff and commissioners' time. Commissioner Del Preto has resigned from the Board; he has spoken to each Commissioner personally. His resignation is the result of the demands on his time due to his new job. The Board will be tasked with appointing someone to fill his position through the end of his term on 4/30/2025. President Jeffery asked for the other board members to pass along any suggestions for candidates, and the process.

## B. DCEO Grant Update

 Executive Director Rini shared staff's recommendation for use of the \$50,000 DCEO grant. She gave a recap of the current Capital Improvement Plan priority listing. Pickleball is the next unfunded project on the list. Staff recommends we use the grant to complete this project, which will address the most frequently requested amenity identified in the 2023 Community Needs Assessment. Commissioners all agreed. Rini noted that staff will move forward with the project and grant.
